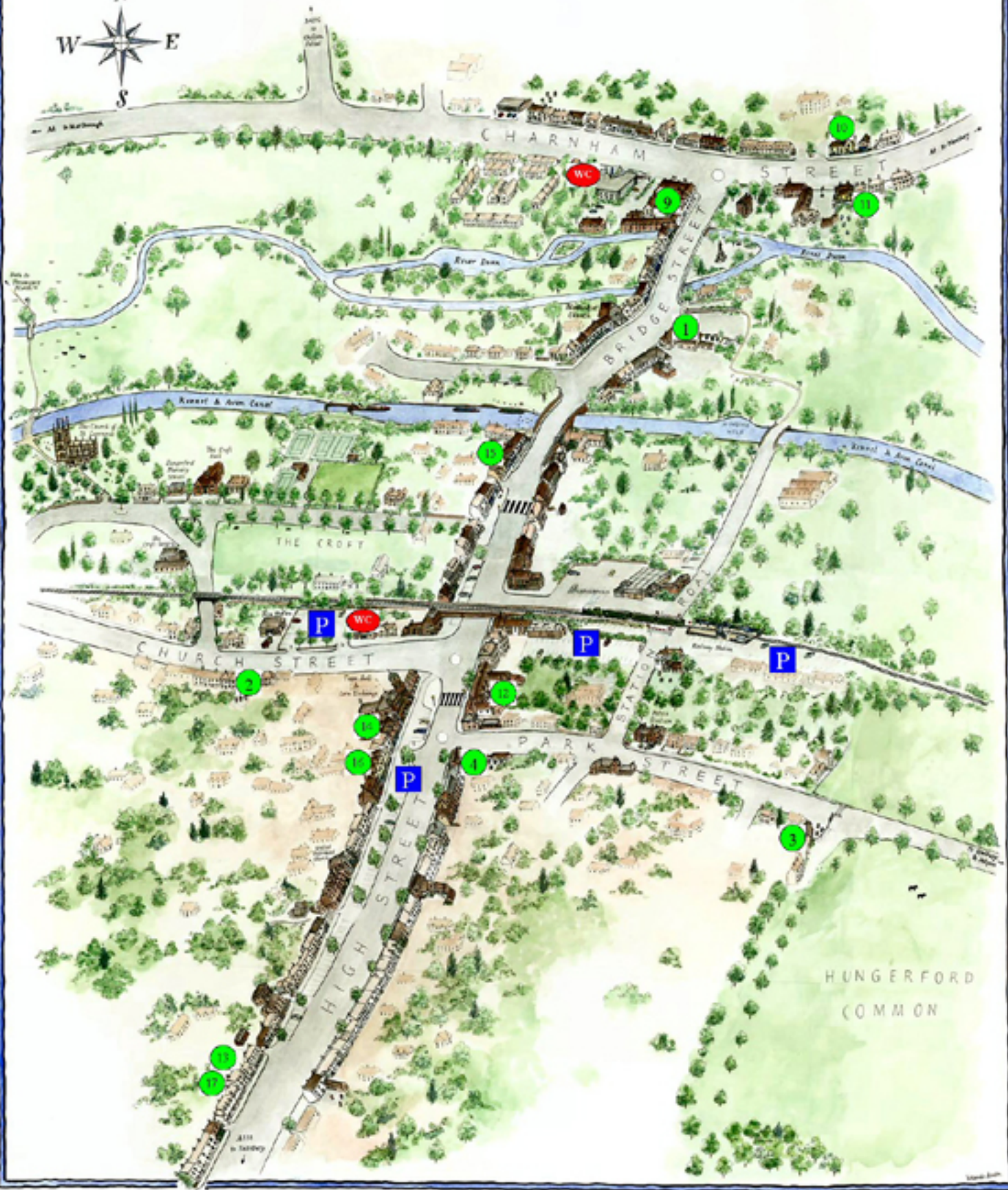


Hungerford Town Centre

2 miles, under one hour, level throughout. Can be muddy in places in winter.

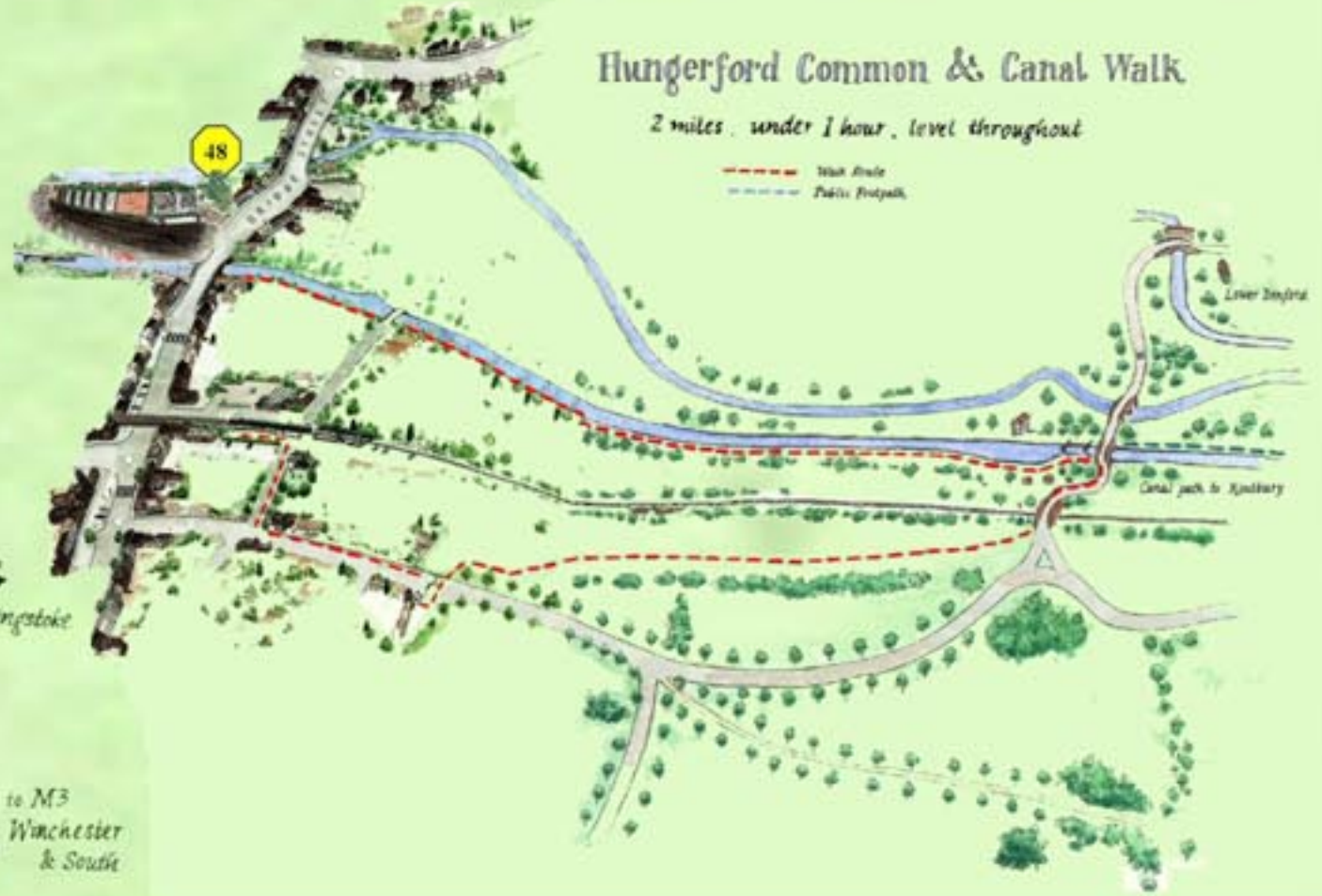
--- Walk Route

Hungerford, at the centre of the North Wessex Downs Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty is the perfect place to discover the hidden treasures of this magnificent and nationally-important protected landscape.

The North Wessex Downs was designated an AONB in 1972 and is the third largest in England stretching from the River Thames in the east to Devizes in the west, Wantage in the north and Andover in the south.

Walking, cycling and riding in the valleys and open chalk downland, you'll appreciate the tranquil beauty of this ancient natural landscape.

From the 3000 year old White Horse at Uffington you can walk the Lambourn Valley to Newbury, enjoying rural pubs on the way. Explore canal-side history and wildlife on the Kennet & Avon Canal. Take the Wayfarer's Walk from Combe Gibbet to Watership Down. Follow King Alfred's Trail around the Vale of Pewsey, visit the Heritage Centre, and pop into the village Tea Room.
